For Maintenance: Any maintenance project or activity requiring the road to be closed. For any emergency road closure of any route as deemed necessary by the County Engineer.2) That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1) AGRICULTURAL LAND: For land by easement or deed: 4.16 times the assessed valuation per acre as it currently exists at the time an offer is made.
- 2) RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL LAND:

For land by easement or deed, where such land is classified by the assessor as residential, commercial or industrial for zoning purposes - generally the appraisal method will be used.

3) FEDERALLY FUNDED PROJECTS, FARM-TO-MARKET FUNDED PROJECTS, AND SPECIAL PURCHASES - APPRAISAL METHOD:

This section will only be utilized when the following conditions are determined to exist:

- 1. Where any buildings or special improvements or appurtenances exist on the parcel being taken.
- 2. Where there are definable damages to the remaining property.
- 3. Where federal funds or farm-to-market funds are involved requiring the complete appraisal method.

- 4. Where the parcel being taken is not representative of the total piece.
- 5. For properties as noted under Section II.

The County Engineer will seek two or more quotes for the service of an appraiser for the review by the Board of Supervisors prior to employment of an appraiser. The appraisal document will serve as the basis for purchase of the parcel.

- 4) BORROW: For land disturbed by reason of borrow or backslope: The value shall be based on the price per cubic yard of material taken (\$0.30/cu.yd.). Agreement will also be made for the restoration of the area disturbed for borrow or backslope, either by removing and replacing 8 inches of top soil or by other appropriate measures, in accordance with Section 314.12, 1995 Code of Iowa. Compensation for crop loss or other land use loss in borrow or backslope areas will be determined based on the rental value for similar land in the area. If crops have been planted, payment will be made to cover tillage cost, seed cost and fertilizer cost based on the pro-rated actual cost incurred. If the crop is harvested before the area is disturbed there will be no compensation for crop loss.
- 5) WATER LINES: For existing privately owned water lines crossing the roadway: The total cost of any alterations required on the line within the new or existing right-of-way will be at the expense of the County.
- 6) FENCES: For the relocation of functional fences made necessary by the reconstruction of an existing roadway, a new fence will be allowed for all of the same type as the existing right-of-way fence. Allowances are \$25.00 per rod for woven wire, \$16.00 per rod for barbed wire. If no fence exists, no fence payment will be allowed. The length for payment will be the footage required to fence the new rightof-way. For relocating cross fences to the new right-of-way, the length of fence required to be moved shall be compensated at the rate for the same type of right-ofway fence above. For angle points introduced into the fence line by the design of the roadway, an allowance of \$166.00 for a two-post panel and \$260.00 for a threepost panel will be made. NOTE: All salvage from the existing fence shall become the property of the property owner. Payment for fencing will be withheld until all existing fence has been removed and cleared from the right-of-way. If the fence or any part thereof is not removed at the time of construction, it will be removed by Scott County or its contractor and a penalty of \$3.00 per rod assessed and deducted from the fence payment. For the removal of non-functional fences made necessary for the reconstruction of an existing roadway, the County will compensate the owner for his labor and equipment at the following rates: Woven Wire - \$10.00 per rod Barbed Wire - \$8.00 per rod

NOTE: All salvage from existing fence shall become the property of the owner. Payment for removal of non-functional fences will be withheld until all existing fences has been removed and cleared from the right-of-way. If fence or any part thereof is not removed at time of construction, it will be removed by Scott County or its contractor and the owner will forfeit any payment tendered for the fence.

DEFINITIONS:

<u>Functional:</u> In good state of repair and capable of containing livestock for which the fence was constructed.

<u>Non-functional:</u> In disrepair and incapable of containing the livestock for which the fence was constructed. Compensation for relocating fences of a type other than those described shall be negotiated.

- 7) TREES AND SHRUBS: For trees and ornamental shrubs which must be removed from the residence areas: compensation will be made on basis of appraisal by an arborist or by negotiation.

CHAPTER 38

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA, BY ADDING CHAPTER 38 AS FOLLOWS:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 38-1: PURPOSE; FINDINGS:

The purpose of this Chapter is to protect the public interest, welfare, health and safety within Scott County by prohibiting the consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) at premises located in the County. The Scott County Board of Supervisors finds that the occurrence of social gatherings at premises where alcoholic beverages are served to or consumed by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) is harmful to such persons themselves and a threat to public welfare, health, and safety. The Board of Supervisors further finds that persons under the age of twenty-one (21) often obtain alcoholic beverages at such gatherings and that persons who are in control of such premises know or have reason to know of such service and/or consumption and will be more likely to ensure that alcoholic beverages are not served or consumed by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) at these gatherings. Based on these findings, the Board of Supervisors has deemed it necessary to enact the following regulations in Scott County.

38-2: DEFINITIONS:

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Chapter, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE means any beverage containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume including alcoholic liquor, wine, and beer.

EMERGENCY RESPONDERS means firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical service personnel, and other personnel having emergency response duties.

ENFORCEMENT SERVICES means the salaries and benefits of emergency responders for the amount of time actually spent responding to or remaining at an event, gathering, or party and administrative costs attributable to the incident; the actual costs for medical treatment for any injured emergency responder, and the costs of repairing any damage to equipment or vehicles.

EVENT, GATHERING, OR PARTY means any group of three (3) or more persons who have assembled or gathered together for a social occasion or other activity where an underage person has consumed or possessed an alcoholic beverage.

PARENT means any person having legal custody of a juvenile: (1) As natural parent, adoptive parent, or step-parent; (2) As a legal guardian; or (3) As a person to whom legal custody has been given by order of the court.

PERSON means any individual, partnership, corporation, or any association of one or more individuals.

PREMISES means any home, yard, farm, field, land, apartment, condominium, hotel or motel room, or other dwelling unit, or a hall or meeting room, park, or any other place of assembly, public or private, whether occupied on a temporary or permanent basis, whether occupied as a dwelling or specifically for a party or other social function, and whether owned, leased, rented, or used with or without permission or compensation.

SOCIAL HOST means any person who aids, conducts, allows, entertains, organizes, supervises, controls, or permits an event, gathering, or party. This includes, but is not limited to: (1) The person(s) who owns, rents, leases, or otherwise has control of the premises where the event, gathering, or party takes place; (2) the person(s) in charge of the premises; or (3) the person(s) who organized the event.

UNDERAGE PERSON means any individual under the age of twenty-one (21).

38-3: PROHIBITED ACTS:

It is unlawful for any social host to host an event, gathering, or party on premises when the person knows or reasonably should know that an underage person has consumed an alcoholic beverage, or possessed an alcoholic beverage with the intent to consume it, and the person fails to take reasonable steps to prevent the possession or consumption by the underage person. A social host who hosts such an event, gathering, or party does not have to be present at the time the prohibited act occurs.

38-4: EXCEPTIONS:

This Ordinance does not apply to conduct solely between an underage person and his or her parents while present in the parents' household, to legally protected religious observances, and to situations where underage persons are lawfully in possession of alcoholic beverages during the course and scope of employment.

38-5: ENFORCEMENT:

The provisions of this Chapter shall be enforced by officers of the Scott County Sheriff's Department. The Scott County Sheriff's Department shall have primary but not exclusive enforcement responsibility for this Chapter.

38-6: PENALTY:

A five hundred dollar (\$500.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's first offense. A seven hundred and fifty dollar (\$750.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's second offense. A one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's third or subsequent offense. In addition, the County may

seek reimbursement for enforcement services provided by emergency responders related to the event, gathering, or party. Multiple violations of this Chapter may be considered by the (City/County) for purposes of approving licenses applied for by the social host, or for any other requirements that are subject to approval by the (City/County).

38-7: REPEALER. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

38-8: SAVINGS CLAUSE. If any section, provision, sentence, clause, phrase, or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or part hereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

38-9: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, adoption, and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA, BY ADDING CHAPTER 38 AS FOLLOWS:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 38-1: PURPOSE; FINDINGS:

The purpose of this Chapter is to protect the public interest, welfare, health and safety within Scott County by prohibiting the consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) at premises located in the County. The Scott County Board of Supervisors finds that the occurrence of social gatherings at premises where alcoholic beverages are served to or consumed by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) is harmful to such persons themselves and a threat to public welfare, health, and safety. The Board of Supervisors further finds that persons under the age of twenty-one (21) often obtain alcoholic beverages at such gatherings and that persons who are in control of such premises know or have reason to know of such service and/or consumption and will be more likely to ensure that alcoholic beverages are not served or consumed by persons under the age of twenty-one (21) at these gatherings. Based on these findings, the Board of Supervisors has deemed it necessary to enact the following regulations in Scott County.

38-2: DEFINITIONS:

The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Chapter, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE means any beverage containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume including alcoholic liquor, wine, and beer.

EMERGENCY RESPONDERS means firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical service personnel, and other personnel having emergency response duties.

ENFORCEMENT SERVICES means the salaries and benefits of emergency responders for the amount of time actually spent responding to or remaining at an event, gathering, or party and administrative costs attributable to the incident; the actual costs for medical treatment for any injured emergency responder, and the costs of repairing any damage to equipment or vehicles.

EVENT, GATHERING, OR PARTY means any group of three (3) or more persons who have assembled or gathered together for a social occasion or other activity where an underage person has consumed or possessed an alcoholic beverage.

PARENT means any person having legal custody of a juvenile: (1) As natural parent, adoptive parent, or step-parent; (2) As a legal guardian; or (3) As a person to whom legal custody has been given by order of the court.

PERSON means any individual, partnership, corporation, or any association of one or more individuals.

PREMISES means any home, yard, farm, field, land, apartment, condominium, hotel or motel room, or other dwelling unit, or a hall or meeting room, park, or any other place of assembly, public or private, whether occupied on a temporary or permanent basis, whether occupied as a dwelling or specifically for a party or other social function, and whether owned, leased, rented, or used with or without permission or compensation.

SOCIAL HOST means any person who aids, conducts, allows, entertains, organizes, supervises, controls, or permits an event, gathering, or party. This includes, but is not limited to: (1) The person(s) who owns, rents, leases, or otherwise has control of the premises where the event, gathering, or party takes place; (2) the person(s) in charge of the premises; or (3) the person(s) who organized the event.

UNDERAGE PERSON means any individual under the age of twenty-one (21).

38-3: PROHIBITED ACTS:

It is unlawful for any social host to host an event, gathering, or party on premises when the person knows or reasonably should know that an underage person has consumed an alcoholic beverage, or possessed an alcoholic beverage with the intent to consume it, and the person fails to take reasonable steps to prevent the possession or consumption by the underage person. A social host who hosts such an event, gathering, or party does not have to be present at the time the prohibited act occurs.

38-4: EXCEPTIONS:

This Ordinance does not apply to conduct solely between an underage person and his or her parents while present in the parents' household, to legally protected religious observances, and to situations where underage persons are lawfully in possession of alcoholic beverages during the course and scope of employment.

38-5: ENFORCEMENT:

The provisions of this Chapter shall be enforced by officers of the Scott County Sheriff's Department. The Scott County Sheriff's Department shall have primary but not exclusive enforcement responsibility for this Chapter.

38-6: PENALTY:

A five hundred dollar (\$500.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's first offense. A seven hundred and fifty dollar (\$750.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's second offense. A one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00) civil penalty shall be imposed for a social host's third or subsequent offense. In addition, the County may seek reimbursement for enforcement services provided by emergency responders related to the event, gathering, or party. Multiple violations of this Chapter may be considered by the (City/County) for purposes of approving licenses applied for by the

social host, or for any other requirements that are subject to approval by the (City/County).

38-7: REPEALER. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

38-8: SAVINGS CLAUSE. If any section, provision, sentence, clause, phrase, or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or part hereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

38-9: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, adoption, and publication as required by law.
