SCOTT COUNTY ORDINANCE No.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 27, OF THE SCOTT COUNTY CODE RELATIVE TO LEAD PROGRAM

BE ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SCOT COUNTY, IOWA: SECTION 1.

The following is a summary of the substantive changes:

Under Sec. 27-2, DEFINITIONS, definitions were added to this section for clarification and interpretation of the ordinance.

Under Sec. 27-6, INSPECTIONS, Scott County Health Department Lead Procedure added.

Under 27-8 LEAD-BASED PAIN T HAZARD REDUCTION, changes to D, E, G, and J.

- D. Requires the services of a person or firm which has a Lead Professional Certification from the Iowa Department of Public Health to conduct work on removing hazardous lead-based paint from surfaces and repainting the surfaces with lead-free paint in homes not owner occupied.
- E. Requires the services of a certified lead abatement contractor in accordance with lowa Administrative Code, 641-70.5(135) to conduct work on hazardous lead-based paint in areas which are chewable or have evidence of impact or friction in homes not owner occupied.
- G. Grass or other approved interim control measures may be used to cover soil-lead hazards.
- J. The Health Officer shall collect a dust wipe sample of the floor, windowsills, and window trough.

SECTION 2.

The County Auditor is directed to keep and maintain a copy of the Ordinance in the County Auditor's office.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any of the provisions of the Ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the Ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

SECTION 4. REPEALER

All Ordinances or parts of the Ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are herby repealed.

SECION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be in full force and in effect after its final passage and publication as by law provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Scott County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The Trustee is hereby authorized to take all action necessary to call the outstanding Certificates for early redemption on November 1, 2011 (the "Redemption Date"), and is further authorized and directed to give notice of such redemption by sending notice to each of the registered owners of the outstanding Certificates to be redeemed at the addresses shown on the Trustee's registration books, not less than 30 and not more than 45 days prior to the Redemption Date. The County Administrator

and County Auditor are authorized to take all further action to effectuate the redemption of the Certificates.

Section 2. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
