SECTION II - RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL LAND: For land by easement or deed, where such land is classified by the assessor as residential, commercial or industrial for zoning purposes - generally the appraisal method will be used. SECTION III - FEDERALLY FUNDED PROJECTS, FARM-TO-MARKET FUNDED PROJECTS, AND SPECIAL PURCHASES - APPRAISAL METHOD: This section will only be utilized when the following conditions are determined to exist:

- 1. Where any buildings or special improvements or appurtenances exist on the parcel being taken.
- 2. Where there are definable damages to the remaining property.
- 3. Where federal funds or farm-to-market funds are involved requiring the complete appraisal method.
- 4. Where the parcel being taken is not representative of the total piece.
- 5. For properties as noted under Section II.

The County Engineer will seek two or more quotes for the service of an appraiser for the review by the Board of Supervisors prior to employment of an appraiser. The appraisal document will serve as the basis for purchase of the parcel. SECTION IV - BORROW: For land disturbed by reason of borrow or backslope: The value shall be based on the price per cubic yard of material taken - (\$0.30/cu.yd.). Agreement will also be made for the restoration of the area disturbed for borrow or backslope, either by removing and replacing 8 inches of top soil or by other appropriate measures, in accordance with Section 314.12, 1995 Code of Iowa. Compensation for crop loss or other land use loss in borrow or backslope areas will be determined based on the rental value for similar land in the area. If crops have been planted, payment will be made to cover tillage cost, seed cost and fertilizer cost based on the pro-rated actual cost incurred. If the crop is harvested before the area is disturbed there will be no compensation for crop loss. SECTION V - WATER LINES: For existing privately owned water lines crossing the roadway: The total cost of any alterations required on the line within the new or existing right-of-way will be at the expense of the County. SECTION VI - FENCES: For the relocation of functional fences made necessary by the reconstruction of an existing roadway, a new fence will be allowed for all of the same type as the existing right-ofway fence. Allowances are \$25.00 per rod for woven wire, \$16.00 per rod for barbed wire. If no fence exists, no fence payment will be allowed. The length for payment will be the footage required to fence the new right-of-way. For relocating cross fences to the new right-of-way, the length of fence required to be moved shall be compensated at the rate for the same type of right-of-way fence above. For angle points introduced into the fence line by the design of the roadway, an allowance of \$166.00 for a two-post panel and \$260.00 for a three-post panel will be made. NOTE: All salvage from the existing fence shall become the property of the property owner. Payment for fencing will be withheld until all existing fence has been removed and cleared from the right-of-way. If the fence or any part thereof is not removed at the time of construction, it will be removed by Scott County or its contractor and a penalty of \$3.00 per rod assessed and deducted from the fence payment. For the removal of non-functional fences made necessary for the reconstruction of an existing roadway, the County will compensate the owner for his labor and equipment at the following rates: Woven Wire - \$10.00 per rod,

Barbed Wire - \$8.00 per rod. NOTE: All salvage from existing fence shall become the property of the owner. Payment for removal of non-functional fences will be withheld until all existing fences has been removed and cleared from the right-of-way. If fence or any part thereof is not removed at time of construction, it will be removed by Scott County or its contractor and the owner will forfeit any payment tendered for the fence. DEFINITIONS: Functional: In good state of repair and capable of containing livestock for which the fence was constructed. Non-functional: In disrepair and incapable of containing the livestock for which the fence was constructed. Compensation for relocating fences of a type other than those described shall be negotiated. SECTION VII- TREES AND SHRUBS: For trees and ornamental shrubs which must be removed from the residence areas: compensation will be made on basis of appraisal by an arborist or by negotiation. IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF SCOTT COUNTY AND CERTAIN CITIES WITHIN SCOTT COUNTY

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SCOTT COUNTY IOWA:

Section 1. Repeal all of Chapter 5, SCOTT COUNTY CODE, 2012.

Section 2. Adopt a new Chapter 5, SCOTT COUNTY CODE, which reads as follows:

SECTION 5-1 TITLE

This Chapter shall be known and referred to collectively as the Scott County International Construction Code.

SECTION 5-2 SCOPE

No building or structure hereafter shall be used, erected, constructed, repaired, moved or demolished unless it fully complies with the requirements of this Ordinance. Not withstanding the foregoing, buildings and structures in existence at the time of the adoption of this Ordinance may have their existing use or occupancy continued, if such use or occupancy complies with the provisions of the Code in effect when initiated, provided however that such continued use is not determined to be dangerous to health, life and safety.

SECTION 5-3 LIMITATIONS

This Ordinance shall not apply within the incorporated area of a City except at the option of the City and in accordance with an agreement with the County. Also, except

to the extent required to implement Section 6.18 of the Scott County Code (General Provisions of the Floodplain Districts) no provisions of this Chapter shall be construed to apply to farm houses, farm barns, farm outbuildings, or other buildings or structures which are primarily adapted, by reason of nature and area for use for agricultural purposes as defined by Section 6-5 of the Scott County Code (Zoning Definitions). It shall be the responsibility of any person or group claiming that certain property is entitled to exemption on the basis of this Section to demonstrate that the property and buildings are primarily adapted and used for agricultural purposes by a farmer.

SECTION 5-4 ADOPTION OF CONSTRUCTION CODES

The International Building Code 2015 Edition, International Energy Conservation Code 2015 Edition, International Residential Code Edition 2015, National Electrical Code 2014 Edition, International Property Maintenance Code 2015 Edition, International Mechanical Code 2015 Edition, Uniform Plumbing Code 2015 Edition, International Swimming Pool and Spa Code 2015 Edition and related codes as referenced, are hereby adopted in full except for such portions as may hereinafter be deleted, modified, or amended. - 1. Foundations may support a roof in addition to the stipulated number of floors. Foundations supporting roofs only shall be as required for supporting one (1) floor. Footings shall be continuous and contain a minimum of two (2) 1/2" reinforcement bars, and have a minimum compressive strength of 2, 500 pounds per square inch at 28 days.
- 2. - (d) Residential siding permits \$50.00
- (e) Residential roofing permits \$50.00
- (f) Commercial roofing permits. Based on job cost and fee from section 5-13 table
- (g) Demolition of structure \$50.00
- (h) Renewal or extension of any permits, one half of original permit fee but in no event less than \$50.00
- (i) Whenever any work for which a permit is required by this code has been commenced without first obtaining said permit, a special investigation shall be made before a permit may be issued for such work. The investigation fee shall be equal to the amount of the permit fee required by this code.

SECTION 5-15 VIOLATIONS UNDER PRIOR CODE

Any building or structure in violation of predecessor Scott County Construction Codes remains in violation unless the successor construction codes eliminate the violation by a change of standards or rules.

SECTION 5-16 NO WHOLESALE ADOPTION OF STATE BUILDING CODE

Although the Scott County International Construction Code contain sections of the Iowa State Building Code, there is no intention of adopting the State Building Code within the meaning of Section 103A, Code of Iowa 2001.

SECTION 5-17 MUNICIPAL INFRACTION

Any person, persons, firm, partnerships or corporations, whether acting alone or in concert with any other, who violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a municipal infraction and shall be penalized as set forth in Chapter 29 of the County Code of Scott County, Iowa.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SCOTT COUNTY IOWA:

Section 1. Repeal all of Chapter 5, SCOTT COUNTY CODE, 2012.

Section 2. Adopt a new Chapter 5, SCOTT COUNTY CODE, which reads as follows:

SECTION 5-1 TITLE

This Chapter shall be known and referred to collectively as the Scott County International Construction Code.

SECTION 5-2 SCOPE

No building or structure hereafter shall be used, erected, constructed, repaired, moved or demolished unless it fully complies with the requirements of this Ordinance. Not withstanding the foregoing, buildings and structures in existence at the time of the adoption of this Ordinance may have their existing use or occupancy continued, if such use or occupancy complies with the provisions of the Code in effect when initiated, provided however that such continued use is not determined to be dangerous to health, life and safety.

SECTION 5-3 LIMITATIONS

This Ordinance shall not apply within the incorporated area of a City except at the option of the City and in accordance with an agreement with the County. Also, except to the extent required to implement Section 6.18 of the Scott County Code (General Provisions of the Floodplain Districts) no provisions of this Chapter shall be construed to apply to farm houses, farm barns, farm outbuildings, or other buildings or structures which are primarily adapted, by reason of nature and area for use for agricultural purposes as defined by Section 6-5 of the Scott County Code (Zoning Definitions). It shall be the responsibility of any person or group claiming that certain property is entitled to exemption on the basis of this Section to demonstrate that the property and buildings are primarily adapted and used for agricultural purposes by a farmer.

SECTION 5-4 ADOPTION OF CONSTRUCTION CODES

The International Building Code 2015 Edition, International Energy Conservation Code 2015 Edition, International Residential Code Edition 2015, National Electrical Code 2014 Edition, International Property Maintenance Code 2015 Edition, International Mechanical Code 2015 Edition, Uniform Plumbing Code 2015 Edition, International Swimming Pool and Spa Code 2015 Edition and related codes as referenced, are hereby adopted in full except for such portions as may hereinafter be deleted, modified, or amended. An official copy of the International Building Code 2015 Edition, International Energy Conservation Code 2015 Edition, International Residential Code 2015 Edition, National Electrical Code 2014 Edition, International Property Maintenance Code 2015 Edition, and the Uniform Plumbing Code 2015 Edition, International Swimming Pool and Spa Code 2015 Edition and all amendments are on file in the office of the Planning and Development Department for public inspection. If any conflict exists between the adopted International Codes, National Electrical Code, Uniform Code, and State Code, the more restrictive code requirement applies.

SECTION 5-5 AMENDMENTS TO THE INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE The following amendments, modifications, additions and deletions to the International Building Code 2015 are hereby made:

- (a) Iowa is inserted as the name of the State and Scott County as the name of the municipality in those parts of the codes where such insertions are necessary or appropriate.
- (b) All references to the building line and zoning are void, and the subject matter of the Zoning Ordinance of Unincorporated Scott County. (Chapter 6 of the Revised Zoning Ordinance for Unincorporated Scott County) shall be applicable.
- (c) Delete Section 103 Department of Public Safety.
- (d) Section 105.3.2 Time limitation of application. Change all reference of 180 days to 30 days.
- (e) Section 105.5 Expiration. Change to read: Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work authorized by such permit is commenced within 180 days after its issuance date, or if the work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. All work shall be completed in one (1) year of the issuance date. The building official is authorized to issue extensions of 180 days for one half the original permit fee or a set fee determined by the building official on the work left to be completed.
- (f) Section 1011.11 Handrails Add Exception 5. Handrails within a dwelling unit or serving and individual dwelling unit may have one (1) offset or interruption per flight of stairs, not both, of a maximum of six (6) inches in total length and shall be considered, for the purpose of this code to be continuous.
- (g) Delete Chapter 11 Accessibility in its entirety, and replace with Chapter 16 Iowa State Building Code (1997), Division VII, Accessibility Rules and Regulations for the Physically Handicapped Section 661-16.700 (103A).
- (h) Delete Chapter 28 Mechanical Systems in its entirety, and replace all references with references to the 2015 International Mechanical Code as adopted by the State of Iowa.
- (i) Delete Chapter 29 Plumbing Systems in its entirety, and replace all references with references to the 2015 Uniform Plumbing Code as promulgated by IAPMO, as adopted by the State of Iowa.
- (j) Delete Appendices A, B, C, D, E, and H in their entireties.
- (k) Delete Chapter 27 Electrical in its entirety and replace with reference to the 2014 National Electric Code as adopted by the State of Iowa.
- (I) Section 1807.3 Embedded post and poles. Add paragraph. All building or portions of buildings containing mechanical installation and connected to underground utilities shall be supported on a continuous perimeter frost free foundation to a minimum depth of 42 inches below finished grade.
- (m) Delete appendices A, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, and M.

SECTION 5-6 AMENDMENTS TO THE INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE The following amendments, modifications, additions and deletions to the International Residential Code 2015 are hereby made:

- (a) Iowa is inserted as the name of the State and Scott County as the name of the jurisdiction in those parts of the codes where such insertions are necessary or appropriate.
- (b) All references to the building line and zoning are void, and the subject matter of the Zoning Ordinance of Unincorporated Scott County. (Chapter 6 of the Revised Zoning Ordinance for Unincorporated Scott County) shall be applicable.
- (c) Delete R103 Department of Building Safety in its entirety.
- (d) Delete R105.2 (1) in its entirety and replace with the following:
- R105.2 (1) One-story detached accessory structures, provided the floor area does not exceed 120 square feet.
- (e) Section R105.3.2 Time limitation of application. Change all reference of 180 days to 30 days.
- (f) Section 105.5 Expiration Change to read: Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work authorized by such permit is commenced within 180 days after its issuance date, or if the work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. All work shall be completed within one (1) year of the issuance date. The Building Official is authorized to issue extensions of 180 days for one half the original fee or a set fee determined by the Building Official on the work left to be completed.

- 1. Foundations may support a roof in addition to the stipulated number of floors. Foundations supporting roofs only shall be as required for supporting one (1) floor. Footings shall be continuous and contain a minimum of two (2) 1/2" reinforcement bars, and have a minimum compressive strength of 2, 500 pounds per square inch at 28 days.
- 2. A one-story wood frame building used for private garage, accessory to a single family dwelling and not over 720 square feet in floor area may be constructed on a floating slab-on-grade provided the following conditions are met: A concrete perimeter grade-beam, twelve inches deep and twelve inches wide and reinforced with two (2) 1/2" reinforcement bars shall be installed to support the exterior walls. A minimum four-inch thick concrete floor slab reinforced with wire mesh or fiber mesh shall be installed within the perimeter beam and shall be formed to allow a continuous pour consisting of the required grade beam and floor.

Exception: Buildings or portions of buildings containing mechanical installations and connected to underground utilities shall be supported on a continuous, frost-free foundation capable of resisting the movement of the slab-on-grade.

- 3. Cast-in-place concrete foundations walls shall be concrete having a minimum compressive strength of 28 days of not less than 3,000 pounds per square inch. All materials proportioning and placing shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 19 of the Administrative Code of the State of Iowa. In addition, the following shall apply:
- a. The minimum thickness of a wall shall be 7 ½ inches.
- b. Walls shall be reinforced with no less than three (3) half-inch diameter deformed ASTM A615 grade 40 steel bars placed horizontally at the center of the wall, with one (1) bar located near the top, one (1) bar located near the bottom, and one (1) bar located near mid-height of the wall.
- c. Reinforcing bars and methods of placement shall be in accordance with Chapter 19 of the Iowa State Building Code
- (j) Add new section R403.1.1.1 Footing requirements for uncovered decks. All decks shall have a minimum footing size of 12 inches in diameter and 42 inches in depth.
- (k) Add new section 403.1.1.2 Footing requirements for covered decks and room additions. All elevated and covered decks, screened rooms, three and four season rooms and room additions shall comply with one of the following footing types;
- 1. Pier footings designed by a licensed design professional and submitted with stamped and signed plans.

- 2. 12 inch wide by 42 inch deep trench footing with 2 number 4 rebar horizontally, one top and one bottom with minimum 3 inches of concrete coverage.
- 3. Spread footing sized with reinforcement per Table R403.1 with a minimum 8 inch masonry or concrete foundation wall.

SECTION 5-16 NO WHOLESALE ADOPTION OF STATE BUILDING CODE Although the Scott County International Construction Code contain sections of the Iowa State Building Code, there is no intention of adopting the State Building Code within the meaning of Section 103A, Code of Iowa 2001.

SECTION 5-17 MUNICIPAL INFRACTION

Any person, persons, firm, partnerships or corporations, whether acting alone or in concert with any other, who violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a municipal infraction and shall be penalized as set forth in Chapter 29 of the County Code of Scott County, Iowa.

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE SCOTT COUNTY CODE AS PRESENTED BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA:

SECTION 1. That the Scott County Code of Ordinances is adopted, including all new ordinances and amendments passed by the Board through this date.

SECTION 2. The County Auditor is directed to keep and maintain a copy of the Ordinance in the County Auditor's Office.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

- 19-4. PERMIT FOR PUBLIC DISPLAY FIREWORKS
- 19-5. REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICATION FOR PERMIT
- 19-6. SHERIFF'S INVESTIGATION
- 19-7. CRITERIA FOR DETERMINATION AND BASIS FOR DENIAL
- 19-8. SEIZURE OF PROHIBITED FIREWORKS
- 19-9. PENALTY PROVISION

SEC. 19-1. DEFINITIONS

- A. For purposes of this chapter, the terms "Consumer Fireworks", "Display Fireworks", and "Novelties" shall have the respective meanings enumerated in Iowa Code §727.2, which definitions are incorporated by reference. Consumer Fireworks do not include "Novelties" or "Display Fireworks" as defined herein.
- B. The term "Organized Group" shall mean any firm, partnership, corporation, association, or other organization of individuals which was not formed solely or primarily for the purpose of obtaining a fireworks permit as hereinafter provided.

 SEC. 19-2 SALE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS

The sale of any consumer fireworks shall at all times be conducted in accordance with all federal, state and local laws, including, but not limited to, lowa Code Chapters 100 and 727 and the administrative rules adopted by the lowa State Fire Marshal relating to the sale, transfer, and purchase of fireworks. For avoidance of doubt, any person desiring to sell fireworks within the unincorporated boundaries of the County shall obtain the applicable permit, including, but not limited to, a casual sales license and zoning regulations, as prescribed by County Code.

SEC. 19-3 CONSUMER FIREWORKS ALLOWED AS SPECIFIED

Consumer Fireworks may be used on July 3 and July 4 from 2 PM until 11 PM and on the night of December 31 from 10 PM until 12:30 AM on the immediate following day. A person shall not use, explode or discharge Consumer Fireworks on real property other than that person's real property or on the real property of a person who has consented to the use of Consumer Fireworks on that property. A person that uses, explodes or discharges Consumer Fireworks shall have responsibility to clean up all debris created by the fireworks. A person shall not release or cause to be released an untethered sky lantern.

SEC. 19-4 PERMIT FOR DISPLAY FIREWORKS

The authority to grant permits for the supervised public exhibit of display fireworks which is granted to the County Board of Supervisors in accordance with the

provisions of Chapter 727 of the Code of Iowa is specifically delegated to the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office may upon application grant a permit for the supervised public display of fireworks by a municipality, fair association, amusement park, government entity, or other organized group. If such permit is granted, the sale, possession, use and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful for that purpose only. No permit granted hereunder shall be transferrable.

The County Board of Supervisors may upon its own motion review any application for a permit which has been granted or denied by the Sheriff's Office, and may affirm or reverse the decision of the Sheriff's Office.

SEC. 19-5 REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

An application for a permit shall be available in the Sheriff's Office. Application for permit for display fireworks shall be made in writing at least fourteen (14) days in advance of date of the display to the Sheriff's Office and include:

- A. A request for permit and a statement concerning the reason for proposed display;
- B. The name of the organized group applying for the permit and the name(s), social security number, date of birth and the address of the person or persons who will act as its agent or representative(s);
- C. Location, date and time of the proposed display in case of rain, an alternative date may be indicated;
- D. The name of the person or persons who will conduct the proposed display and a copy of the current certificate or license as a pyro technician.
- E. At the time application is made for a permit; attach thereto a certificate of insurance naming the applicant as insured and Scott County shall be named as an additional insured on the policy. The applicant shall maintain bodily injury liability insurance/property damage liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence / 2,000,000 aggregate.

In addition the applicant agrees by the execution hereof the permit to indemnify and hold harmless Scott County against all liabilities, costs and expenses which may arise in consequence of the granting of this permit; except as may result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Scott County.

F. A one hundred dollar (\$100.00) fee. Said fee shall be refundable if the application is denied. Subject to approval of said application, the fee shall be deposited in the county general fund.

SEC. 19-6. SHERIFF'S INVESTIGATION

The Sheriff's Office who may conduct any investigation deemed necessary to determine whether a permit should be granted for display fireworks. The applicant shall immediately provide to the Sheriff's Office all additional information requested to further this investigation. The Sheriff's Office shall grant or deny the application within seven (7) days of the date it is received. Upon making its determination, the Sheriff's Office shall immediately inform the applicant whether the application was granted or denied. SEC. 19-7. CRITERIA FOR DETERMINATION AND BASIS FOR DENIAL

The Sheriff's Office shall consider each of the following criteria in making its determination whether to grant or deny an application for display fireworks. In the event that an application is denied, the Sheriff's Office shall submit to the applicant a written statement which will briefly detail which of the following criteria the denial was based

upon, as well as any other factors which were considered as basis for denying the application.

- A. The size and location of the proposed display site as each relates to the potential for damage to nearby property or injury to persons;
- B. The training, experience and past reliability of the person or persons named in the application to conduct the proposed display. Specifically, whether a certified and licensed pyro technician will conduct the display may be taken under consideration.
- C. The manner in which the organized group making the application conducted past fireworks displays;
- D. Whether or not all of the requirements of an application per permit as set forth in Section 19-5 were complied with by the applicant. Specifically, any application which is not accompanied by a bond or certificate of insurance as required in Section 19-5 (F) shall be denied;
- E. The likelihood that the time or date of the display would unreasonably disturb nearby residents;
- F. Any special safety considerations which the Sheriff's Office might determine to be unique to the particular proposed display and the applicant's proposed manner of dealing with those special safety considerations.

If an application is denied, the applicant shall be given an opportunity to amend the application and to resubmit it to the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office shall consider the amended application in light of its written statement of the reasons for denial of the original application. If it appears that the amendments to the application adequately remedy the situation or situations which gave rise to denial of the original application, then the amended application for a permit shall be granted.

SEC. 19-8. SEIZURE OF PROHIBITED FIREWORKS

The Sheriff's Office shall seize, take, remove, or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner all stocks of fireworks offered or exposed for sale, stored or held in violation of this Chapter.

SEC. 19-9. PENALTY PROVISION A person who violates this chapter commits a simple misdemeanor punishable as follows:

A. First Offense \$250
B. Second Offense \$400
C. Third and Subsequent \$625

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any of the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

SEC. 19-1. DEFINITIONS

- A. For purposes of this chapter, the terms "Consumer Fireworks", "Display Fireworks", and "Novelties" shall have the respective meanings enumerated in Iowa Code §727.2, which definitions are incorporated by reference. Consumer Fireworks do not include "Novelties" or "Display Fireworks" as defined herein.
- B. The term "Organized Group" shall mean any firm, partnership, corporation, association, or other organization of individuals which was not formed solely or primarily for the purpose of obtaining a fireworks permit as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 19-2 SALE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS

The sale of any consumer fireworks shall at all times be conducted in accordance with all federal, state and local laws, including, but not limited to, lowa Code Chapters 100 and 727 and the administrative rules adopted by the lowa State Fire Marshal relating to the sale, transfer, and purchase of fireworks. For avoidance of doubt, any person desiring to sell fireworks within the unincorporated boundaries of the County shall obtain the applicable permit, including, but not limited to, a casual sales license and zoning regulations, as prescribed by County Code.

SEC. 19-3 CONSUMER FIREWORKS ALLOWED AS SPECIFIED

Consumer Fireworks may be used on July 3 and July 4 from 2 PM until 11 PM and on the night of December 31 from 10 PM until 12:30 AM on the immediate following day. A person shall not use, explode or discharge Consumer Fireworks on real property other than that person's real property or on the real property of a person who has consented to the use of Consumer Fireworks on that property. A person that uses, explodes or discharges Consumer Fireworks shall have responsibility to clean up all debris created by the fireworks. A person shall not release or cause to be released an untethered sky lantern.

SEC. 19-4 PERMIT FOR DISPLAY FIREWORKS

The authority to grant permits for the supervised public exhibit of display fireworks which is granted to the County Board of Supervisors in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 727 of the Code of Iowa is specifically delegated to the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office may upon application grant a permit for the supervised public display of fireworks by a municipality, fair association, amusement park, government entity, or other organized group. If such permit is granted, the sale, possession, use and distribution of fireworks for such display shall be lawful for that purpose only. No permit granted hereunder shall be transferrable.

The County Board of Supervisors may upon its own motion review any application for a permit which has been granted or denied by the Sheriff's Office, and may affirm or reverse the decision of the Sheriff's Office.

SEC. 19-5 REQUIREMENTS OF APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

An application for a permit shall be available in the Sheriff's Office. Application for permit for display fireworks shall be made in writing at least fourteen (14) days in advance of date of the display to the Sheriff's Office and include:

- A. A request for permit and a statement concerning the reason for proposed display;
- B. The name of the organized group applying for the permit and the name(s), social security number, date of birth and the address of the person or persons who will act as its agent or representative(s);
- C. Location, date and time of the proposed display in case of rain, an alternative date may be indicated;
- D. The name of the person or persons who will conduct the proposed display and a copy of the current certificate or license as a pyro technician.
- E. At the time application is made for a permit; attach thereto a certificate of insurance naming the applicant as insured and Scott County shall be named as an additional insured on the policy. The applicant shall maintain bodily injury liability insurance/property damage liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence / 2,000,000 aggregate.

In addition the applicant agrees by the execution hereof the permit to indemnify and hold harmless Scott County against all liabilities, costs and expenses which may arise in consequence of the granting of this permit; except as may result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Scott County.

F. A one hundred dollar (\$100.00) fee. Said fee shall be refundable if the application is denied. Subject to approval of said application, the fee shall be deposited in the county general fund.

SEC. 19-6. SHERIFF'S INVESTIGATION

The Sheriff's Office who may conduct any investigation deemed necessary to determine whether a permit should be granted for display fireworks. The applicant shall immediately provide to the Sheriff's Office all additional information requested to further this investigation. The Sheriff's Office shall grant or deny the application within seven (7) days of the date it is received. Upon making its determination, the Sheriff's Office shall immediately inform the applicant whether the application was granted or denied. SEC. 19-7. CRITERIA FOR DETERMINATION AND BASIS FOR DENIAL

The Sheriff's Office shall consider each of the following criteria in making its determination whether to grant or deny an application for display fireworks. In the event that an application is denied, the Sheriff's Office shall submit to the applicant a written statement which will briefly detail which of the following criteria the denial was based upon, as well as any other factors which were considered as basis for denying the application.

- A. The size and location of the proposed display site as each relates to the potential for damage to nearby property or injury to persons;
- B. The training, experience and past reliability of the person or persons named in the application to conduct the proposed display. Specifically, whether a certified and licensed pyro technician will conduct the display may be taken under consideration.
- C. The manner in which the organized group making the application conducted past fireworks displays;

- D. Whether or not all of the requirements of an application per permit as set forth in Section 19-5 were complied with by the applicant. Specifically, any application which is not accompanied by a bond or certificate of insurance as required in Section 19-5 (F) shall be denied;
- E. The likelihood that the time or date of the display would unreasonably disturb nearby residents;
- F. Any special safety considerations which the Sheriff's Office might determine to be unique to the particular proposed display and the applicant's proposed manner of dealing with those special safety considerations.

If an application is denied, the applicant shall be given an opportunity to amend the application and to resubmit it to the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office shall consider the amended application in light of its written statement of the reasons for denial of the original application. If it appears that the amendments to the application adequately remedy the situation or situations which gave rise to denial of the original application, then the amended application for a permit shall be granted.

SEC. 19-8. SEIZURE OF PROHIBITED FIREWORKS

The Sheriff's Office shall seize, take, remove, or cause to be removed at the expense of the owner all stocks of fireworks offered or exposed for sale, stored or held in violation of this Chapter.

SEC. 19-9. PENALTY PROVISION A person who violates this chapter commits a simple misdemeanor punishable as follows:

A. First Offense \$250
B. Second Offense \$400
C. Third and Subsequent \$625

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.
